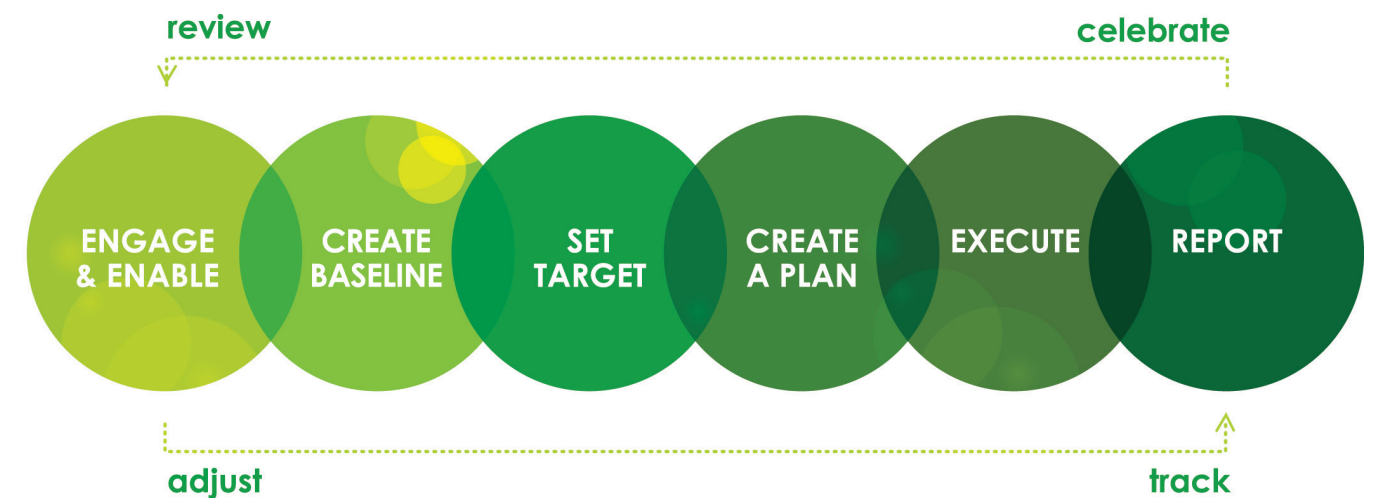
This report provides an overview of what was achieved since our launch back in June 2015, while focusing on what's next for the sustainability story in the National Capital Region.

Carbon 613 EnviroCentre's flagship program for business sustainability

Carbon 613, EnviroCentre's target-based sustainability program, has been developed with businesses in mind and supports EnviroCentre's vision of dramatic reductions in greenhouse gas emissions achieved through inspired environmental action and positive change.



Participating organizations are plugged into a local network and are supported in setting targets to reduce their carbon emissions in their own business practices. Through this combined approach, we, as businesses and individuals within those businesses, can contribute to being part of the carbon reduction solution.



EnviroCentre's Carbon 613 is one of eight environmental non-profit organizations across Ontario that make up the CoLab Network. Carbon 613 and the other network programs are convening networks of businesses that are setting and achieving targets to reduce their environmental impacts while enhancing their competitive advantage and stimulating the low-carbon economy.

catalyzers:

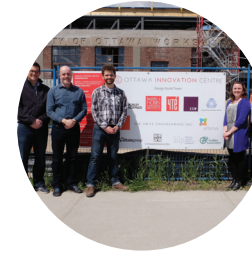
are organizations which support **Carbon 613** with a one-time financial investment ensuring the long-term viability of the program.

Canadian Museum of Nature is home to one of the world's largest and finest natural history collections. Beyond the public facing vibrant exhibits, the organization is composed of world-renowned research scientists, educators, collection specialists, and innovators. With two facilities, sustainability is an important piece to operating and managing the museum's daily activities.

Highlights

- Implemented a comprehensive waste management program that includes recycling and composting.
- LED-retrofitted 191 fixtures from 100 watt lamps to 6.5 watt lamps.
- Introduced the Green Meeting approach with various working groups and committees.
- Installed low-to-no water consuming fixtures.
- Developed and implemented the Landscapes of Canada Gardens to minimize Groundskeeping activities.

Highlights

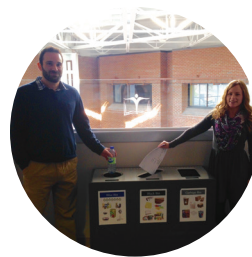
- Introduced work shifting for employees.
- Track and weigh all of our recycling, composting, and garbage.
- Completed waste diversion best practices presentation for staff.
- 50% staff do not own a car and many are passionate cyclists, advocating for a safe and emissions free commute year-round!

Future goals

- Continue to “walk the walk” by setting 2016 as the baseline year.
- Engage staff more frequently with creative activities that support a healthier, happier, work environment.

The OCDSB is the largest school board in Ottawa. Sustainability is an integral component of how the school board manages and operates facilities that they occupy. They also instill a culture that engages students, teachers, and administrative staff in playing a role in caring for the environment.

Highlights

- Environmental Stewardship a significant component of Board's 2015-2019 Strategic Plan.
- Energy management and Conservation Department lead annual initiatives including renewable energy projects and waste diversion strategies.
- 58 Schools (1 in 3) certified under the Ontario EcoSchools Program, each with their own Green Teams.
- Completed the 41st roof mounted solar PV installation in 2015.
- Replacement of 20 gasoline fleet vehicles to 2015 compact hybrid vehicles.



Smarter Shift

Operating since 1984, Smarter Shift is a small, home-based business that specializes in climate and energy communications and analysis, social media management, and online content curation.

Sustainability commitment

Low-to-zero impact sustainability goals have always been built into Smarter Shift's business planning.

Highlights

- Moved out of commercial space in 2010 to eliminate daily commute and reduce carbon footprint.
- Moved to a new build LEED certified home office in 2015.

what's next?

Do you feel it? The Paris Agreements has brought a sense of optimism and urgency across Canada. Climate change is a top priority for businesses and governments, to prevent global temperature rise from exceeding 1.5 degrees Celsius.



The Government of Canada has committed to reach ambitious goals set out by the global agreement on climate change.

The federal budget includes investments in clean energy and the Prime Minister is engaging with each province to discuss a price on carbon.

In 2015, Ontario became the first province in Canada to set a GHG reduction target of 37% below 1990 levels by 2030 and announce a cap and trade system.

The province also allocated \$ 1 million from the Green Investment Fund in the Sustainability CoLab Network.

In Ottawa, the City of Ottawa set a new target of 80% emissions reduction below the 2012 baseline by 2050 and commits to mitigate and adapt to climate change over the next 20 years.

future for Carbon 613

Carbon 613 looks forward to working with businesses in the National Capital Region to develop initiatives that simultaneously help them meet their carbon reduction goals and reduce the carbon output of the city.
